Join us at the sixth annual Family Literacy Carnival presented by MacEwan University Golden Key International Honour Society students and the Centre for Family Literacy.

The Family Literacy Carnival is a place to wander, explore, participate and just have fun – maybe even bring home a prize. Celebrate National Family Literacy Day by joining us at the Carnival on Sunday, January 28 at Robbins Health Learning Centre, MacEwan University (109 St and 104 Ave) from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m.

This free event is for the whole family. Come and participate in fun activities that support language and learning. Families will receive a “passport” that will guide them through the interactive literacy activity centres. The students and the Centre’s staff have worked together to come up with some great ways for families to share learning together.

Themes for the centres include science, music, play, technology, health, math, and an Indigenous centre. Special guests will read from their

favourite books, and there will be singing and rhyming to engage the whole family.

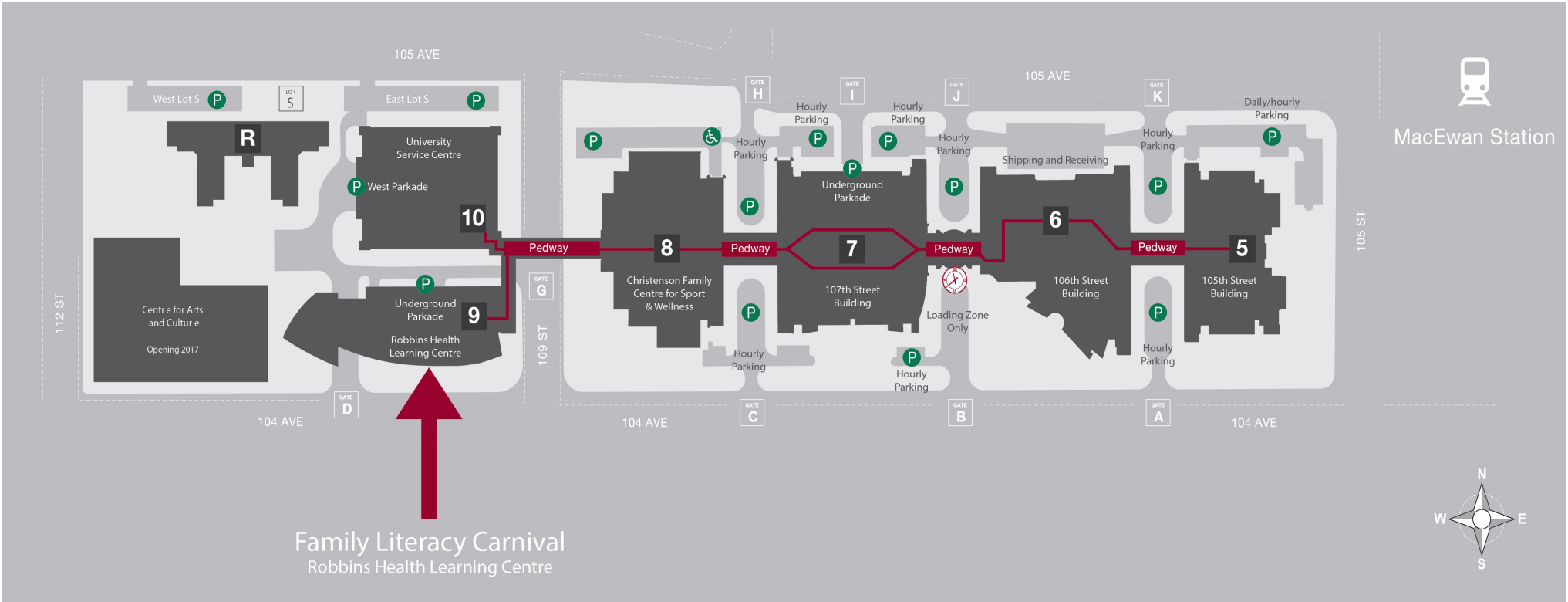
**Families who visit a minimum of four centres and have their passports stamped will receive a free children’s book to take home with them, while quantities last.**

There are two activities at each centre, one for children ages 1–4 and one for children ages 5+. The activities are intended for parents and guardians to do along with their children. All families with children are welcome.
