Crayon Leaf Prints

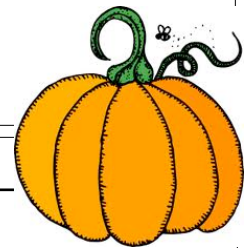
Materials Needed:

3. If you want to, hang your leaf prints on the family refrigerator or bulletin board.
